

# Pencil Roll & Project Pouch

#### **Pencil Roll**

# Requirements

Main Fabric Make a piece of patchwork to measure  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $9\frac{1}{2}$ "

Lining Fabric 12½" x 9½" Pocket Fabric 12½" x 9" Wadding 12½" x 9½"

Piping Cord 25"

#### Making your Pencil Roll

- Make a piece of patchwork to measure 12½" x 9½". This can be a simple strippy piece or perhaps squares the choice is yours.
- Fold the pocket fabric in half to measure  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Place the pocket on the lining fabric matching raw edges.
- Draw lines from top of pocket down to the raw edge 1" apart. Machine stitch along the lines starting at the raw edge to the top of the pocket and down again.
- Place the main fabric on top of the pocket/lining right sides together and pace on top of the wadding.
- Make a loop at one end of the cord and fold the rest of the cord back along the loop. Place in one short side in between the 2 pieces of fabric making sure the loop and the long piece of cord in inside.
- Machine around the pencil roll leaving a gap on the short side opposite the inserted loop.
- Turn right side out and close gap.

## **Project Pouch**

## Requirements

Main Fabric 10" x 14" Lining Fabric 10" x 14" Wadding 10" x 14"

Piping Cord 18"

# Making your project pouch

- Place the main fabric right side up on top of the wadding. Machine or hand quilt.
- Place the lining fabric on top of main fabric right sides together.
- Mark the centre point on one short side and then measure  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " down each long side from each corner. Draw a line from the centre point to each side point.
- Insert the piping cord at the point on the short side. Pin in place.
- Machine stitch along the opposite short side.
- Fold the lower edge back in between the main fabric and lining  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- Machine stitch around the pouch leaving the folded edge unstitched and a gap for turning above the folded piece.
- Clip corners and turn right side out. Hand stitch gap closed.
- The cord can be wrapped around the pouch to keep it closed.
